
BIGFOOT TABLE

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Paul T. Frankl (1886–1958) designed the Bigfoot coffee table for the Michigan-based Johnson Furniture Company in the late 1940s. The low, cloud-shaped table was marketed as a "cocktail table," a modernized version of the more classic coffee table. The Big foot coffee table is undoubtedly one of Paul T. Frankl's masterpieces, an enduring and visually commanding design. The new production of the table is according to the original design and has been authorized by Paul T. Frankl's heirs.



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MAINTENANCE

Lacquered cork is a durable material, but regular maintenance ensures it retains its beauty and longevity. Follow these simple steps to care for your lacquered cork surfaces.

1. Routine Cleaning

<u>Dust regularly:</u> Use a soft, dry cloth or microfiber duster to remove dust.

<u>Damp wipe:</u> Use a damp (not wet) cloth with warm water and mild soap. Avoid excessive water. <u>Dry immediately:</u> After wiping, use a dry cloth to remove any moisture.

2. Spill Management

Wipe quickly: Clean spills immediately to prevent staining or water damage.

Use mild cleaners: Avoid abrasive or acidic cleaners. A mild soap solution is sufficient.

3. Protection Tips

Avoid direct sunlight: Prolonged exposure can fade and weaken the lacquer.

Protect from heat: Avoid placing hot items directly on the cork surface; use coasters or trivets.

4. Avoid

Harsh chemicals: Do not use bleach, ammonia, or solvents.

Excessive moisture: Prolonged dampness can damage the cork.

Rough tools: Avoid scouring pads or abrasive sponges.
